PPE (Personal Protection Equipment): Gloves, masks, and alcohol wipes CANNOT be recycled in your curbside recycling cart. Please consider the reusable options for masks and wipes. **Terracycle** (www.terracycle.com) has a collection box in three sizes you can order for your home or office.

Take-Out Containers: Please decline any extras such as utensils, napkins, and excess condiment packets. Many take-out containers are not recyclable.

These can be recycled:

- Clear plastic tub-shaped containers (round or rectangle)
- Clear plastic clamshell containers

These cannot be recycled:

- Black plastic
- Thin, flat lids
- Straws
- Foam or small sauce containers
- Any utensils
- Compostable containers (compost them instead!)

Delivery Packaging: Many online companies have low-impact shipping options, or combine items to use less packaging. Check out <u>Amazon Second Chance</u> for package recycling tips and re-use options, and search "Amazon Shipment Zero" for additional information about sustainability initiatives at Amazon.

- Bubble wrap: Bubble wrap can be dropped off to recycle with your other plastic film items (grocery bags, cereal and cracker box liners, etc.). Do not put in your curbside recycling.
- Cardboard boxes: Remove all packing material from box, flatten box, and recycle in curbside.
- Plastic pillows or bags: Check for How2Recycle label on packaging, and follow that instruction. Plastic film with a #2 or #4 stamp can be recycled at grocery store programs. Pop the pillows before recycling.
- Plastic envelope mailers: Most plastic envelope mailers (with or without bubble-wrap inners) can be recycled through grocery store programs but not in curbside recycling. Remove and dispose of label before recycling by cutting it off and placing in trash.
- Paper envelope mailers: Because there are many different kinds of mailer envelopes, look for the How2Recycle label and follow instructions. If there is not a How2Recycle label, it is probably not recyclable.
- Styrofoam: See Styrofoam drop-off locations on page 11.

Another good resource is www.How2Recycle.com. **How2Recycle** is a standardized labeling system that communicates recycling instructions. Many household brands are starting to use it—check your packaging!

Large appliances are banned from landfills in Illinois. Many stores will pick up your old appliance for recycling when they deliver the new one. For refrigerators, freezers and other freon-bearing appliances, proof of proper Freon removal may be required prior to recycling. Fees may apply—check with waste hauler.

Aerosols: Empty completely and recycle in your curbside container (EXCEPT paint—please see page 9 for details).

CDs, DVDs, VHS tapes, Cassettes, and Cases: Unfortunately there are no local recycling programs for these items, so they can go in the trash. Cardboard inserts or sleeves can be recycled in your curbside container.

Construction Debris: Please visit or call Lowe Enterprises at www.loweenterprisesinc.com/recycling or call (847) 639-2775 for pricing and hours.

Carbon Monoxide (CO): Detectors can be disposed of in the regular trash.

Cardboard Boxes: If you are comfortable, offer them on social media! Otherwise, flatten and recycle in your curbside container.

Corks: The Wine Cellar Outlet Schaumburg, 1422 E. Algonquin Rd, Schaumburg. Call (224) 801-6677 to confirm drop-off hours. Visit www.recork.com for other drop-off locations (none in McHenry County).

Gasoline: This is considered a household hazardous waste. Please see page 7.

Furniture: If reusable, donate to the Habitat for Humanity Restores (listings on page 3) or Goodwill (listing on page 3). If beyond use, contact your hauler for bulk item pick up to be landfilled.

Mattresses: Verlo Mattress store (Crystal Lake, (815) 455-2570) will take old mattresses if you purchase one from them. Otherwise, you can list on one of the online platforms (Craigslist, Freecycle, etc.) if it's reusable. If it is beyond reuse, contact your hauler for bulk item pickup to be landfilled. Also, see these online Mattress Disposal Guides from Myslumberyard.com, Sleep.org, Tuck.com, RestRightMattress.com and HealthySleepy.com.

Microwaves: These are considered electronics. Please see page 6.

Prescription Medication: Most local police stations have a collection container but do not take any liquids. Please call your police station for drop-off hours and bin location.

Propane Gas Tanks (Small Camp-Sized): Go to manufacturers' website to find puncture-hole location and instructions. Once punctured, take to Behr Iron and Metal, 13914 Washington Street in Woodstock.

Propane Gas Tanks (30 Gallon-Sized Tanks): Call the store you bought it from to see if they will take the tank back, or use one of the exchange services found at many home improvement stores. If the valve is removed, or it is damaged in such a way that you can see inside, take it to Behr Iron and Metal, 13914 Washington St, Woodstock.

- The Amerigas office in Palatine will take propane gas tanks in any condition (apparently there is nationwide shortage of tanks!). The only office open to the public is in Palatine, 522 S. Vermont Street, Palatine, (847) 359-6450.
- Another Option: Small, camp-sized propane cylinders and larger tanks, full or empty, can be dropped off at The Crusher, 651 W Washington St, West Chicago, IL 60185, (630) 231-6888.

Smoke Detectors: These are not banned from the landfill, so they can be thrown in the regular trash. You can return used smoke alarms to the supplier—the address is usually listed in the product warranty or user's manual. You can use one of these mail-in programs: Curie Environmental Services (NM), (505) 888-9392; EZ on the Earth (IN), (855) 327-8455; or First Alert Corp (IL), (630) 851-7330.

Thermostats: Visit Thermostat Recycling Corporation (thermostat-recycle.org) and enter your zip code for the closest drop off locations for mercury thermostats (over 20 years old or more). There are many locations in McHenry County.

Sharps Drop Off: Island Lake Police Department, 3720 Greenleaf Ave, Island Lake, or Wauconda Police Department, 311 S Main St, Wauconda.

Textiles: Please see the Goodwill listing on page 3 or visit www.USagain.com to find one of the many collection boxes available around the county. The Defenders will also collect textiles at the County Recycling drives. See page 16 for details.
